Why Writers Workshop?

"Researchers have realized that when writing is not just assigned and corrected but it is also explicitly taught, then all kids can learn to write well."

Writers Workshop At A Glance

- Assessment based
- Includes 3 genres: narrative, expository and persuasive
- Daily lessons include:
 - Minilesson
 - Independent writing:
 - Students draft, revise, edit and publish
 - Teacher meets with students individually/small groups
 - Share time to reflect on learning

Support At Home

- Promote a writerly life at home through storytelling
- Newsletters for each unit contain additional activities
- Focus on what your child is doing well, and pick one area of focus

Why Word Study?

- "Research tells us there are 5 developmental stages of spelling development."
- "Students learn to spell when teachers assess the stage of spelling and use it to guide their instruction."

Word Study at a Glance

- Improves student's ability to notice spelling patterns
- Challenges students to think why words are spelled a certain way
- Allows students to learn words at their **individual** level of instruction

Word Study in the Classroom

- Weekly word study will focus on a spelling pattern, oddballs, and High Frequency words
- Students will practice words through a variety of sorts
- Assessments based on observation of sorts, spelling words in writing, and weekly assessment checks

Support at Home

- Weekly sorts will go home along with opportunities for practicing sorts
- If your child asks you to spell a word, encourage a strategy **before** giving the word
